Provincial legislation states that there shall be <u>NO OPEN-AIR BURNING</u> unless authorized! Campfires are often a form of entertainment and do not require a permit provided the person who is responsible, ultimately the owner, follows the definition and criteria below as stated.

"A campfire is a fire that provides light and warmth, and heat for cooking. It can also serve as a beacon, and an insect and predator deterrent".

- Camping Fire" means an open-air fire not exceeding 0.6 m (2 ft.) by 0.6 m (2 ft.) by 0.6 m (2 ft.) high that is set and maintained solely for the purposes of cooking food, providing warmth or recreational enjoyment. Things like rock, tire rims, etc. are all acceptable borders.
- The fire must be always supervised and must be extinguished before the person supervising leaves the area.
- Only <u>clean wood product can be burned</u>, and such product must not be treated or painted for environmental reasons. There shall be <u>No Burning of</u> <u>Construction Material of any kind</u>.
- The fire can not cause "material discomfort" to those around. Should there be a complaint the fire may be extinguished, and the owner could be assessed the fees for the fire department response as set out in the Municipal By-Law.
- Weather conditions must be considered before any Campfires or Open-Air Burning is attempted. Pay attention to Municipal directives should there be "burning bans" in place.
- Always have a means to extinguish the fire should conditions change.
- Fires that exceed the above Campfire criteria must be inspected first and must be approved by obtaining a Municipal Burning Permit provided the request is acceptable to the Chief Fire Official.
